Dear Bror Wm.

As Gen'l. B, leaves us in the Mornng, I send you by him my check for fifty two hundred & fifty dollars (\$5250#) in gold, for you to invest for me, as you kindly said “to send it when I recd it, also Sophie’s second quarterly check, for \$625# six hundred & twenty five dollars. You will see my check is on E. D. Morgan & Co., they wish to know (I think) where I deposite it, or it is invested. I heard Sister Ellen & V’ne, were to remain at their friends house while in Lou’lle. I had a letter from Miss Bromley & Shears, making it all right; now all that detains me is attending to my dear ones tomb, and when night comes am completely worn out, running from “Dan to Bersheba.” & yet contiually delayed. Sophie received the Elcelsior or Certificate, as being *first*, in all her Classes, & the premium (a copy of Tennysons Poems) for French & Latin. What do you think of the nomination? Let us trust in God all will come right. Hope to hear from you soon, with a kiss from Sophie.
